# BURSARY SCHEME

## *About the Association*

The Choir Association was formed in 1995 from the Old Choristers' Association. It exists to serve all current and former members of the College Choir.

Funding is through annual/life member subscription, personal donation and fundraising activities.

All funds, over and above those used for administration, are made available to assist the Choir and its current and former members, in their musical endeavours.

## *The Bursary Scheme*

In 1998 a bursary scheme was introduced to which any current or former Chorister, Choral Student or Organ Student might apply. The scheme which provides one-off sums of money to assist with a musical project, activity or piece of equipment, which applicants are unable to entirely fund themselves.

At the moment, awards are in the region of £250 and are subject to the level of funds generally available at the time. It is hoped that in time, larger awards will be made, dependant upon the number and generosity of our subscribers.

Successful applicants will be notified of any award following the July Annual General Meeting of the Association. Awards are paid prior to the commencement of the academic year.
